Chapter 10: SCHOOL-COMMUNITY RELATIONS Section 4: COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

Gifts, Grants, and Bequests

The district may accept any gift, grant, or bequest of money or property on behalf of the Board of Education. Before accepting any gift, grant, or bequest, the district will consider whether the gift, grant, or bequest:

- 1. Has a purpose consistent with the Board's vision and philosophy.
- 2. Begins a program that the Board will be unable to continue when the funds are exhausted.
- 3. Entails undesirable or excessive costs.
- 4. Implies excessive endorsement of any business or product.

All gifts, grants, or bequests that are accepted by the district shall be administered in pursuance of the terms of the gift, grant, or bequest. Any gift, grant, or bequest shall become the property of the school district and shall be under control of the Board of Education. Any gift, grant, or bequest for alterations to buildings, or to building grounds involving money, equipment, and/or furnishings, will be reviewed by the Buildings and Grounds Department and will be brought to the Facilities/Support Services Committee. The committee will make a recommendation to the Board of Education.
