Promotion and Retention

The guiding philosophy for determining promotion or retention will be what is in the best

interest of the student.

The general policy of the district is to encourage and assist each student to move along in a

continuous growth pattern of academic achievement based upon established curriculum, standards,

and benchmarks. The principal, in arriving at a decision for retention of a student, will consider the

combined views of the parents and appropriate members of the school staff, as well as academic and

behavioral/social data.

When a student is not meeting grade level expectations, parents/legal guardians and school

staff will meet to determine the appropriate instructional intervention.

For each student identified as at-risk of meeting required expectations, staff and

parents/guardians will prepare an individual plan, which will include a description of all

interventions designed to help the student meet performance expectations. The principal of each

school is responsible for monitoring the development and implementation of intervention plans.
