

## Common Irregular Verbs

Irregular verbs do not add -ed to form the past tense. They completely change their form. Some of the **most common irregular verbs** are *be*, *do*, and *have*.

Here are the different forms of the verb, *be*.

Verb	Subject (who or what)	Present Tense	Past Tense
be	he, she, it	is	was
be	we, you, they	are	were
be	I	am	was

Here are the different forms of the verb, *do*.

Verb	Subject (who or what)	Present Tense	Past Tense
do	he, she, it	does	did
do	I, we, you, they	do	did

Here are the different forms of the verb, *have*.

Verb	Subject (who or what)	Present Tense	Past Tense
have	he, she, it	has	had
have	I, we, you, they	have	had
