Noun Suffixes

A **noun suffix** is a word ending that changes the word it is based on to a noun. The original word may be a verb or an adjective. The suffix may be a letter or a group of letters.

Some common noun suffixes include these:

```
-ment, -ness, -tion, -ty
```
