A <u>noun</u> is a person, place or thing. (doctor, Mrs. Jones, store, Target, toys, Legos, frog, Harry Potter, Wednesday)
An <u>adjective</u> is a word that describes a noun. (amazing, sad, large, red, wide, straight, bumpy, fast, valuable, important, tiny)
A <u>verb</u> is an action or describes what a noun does. (vibrate, ask, decide, hear, fly, be, do, have, become, play, build, love, enjoy)
