Regular Verbs

Verbs tell what a subject does or is.

- Ben yelled at his sister.
- Jen **grabs** the rope.

There can be more than one verb in a sentence, a **main verb** and a *helping verb* (is, was, are, were, did, would, can).

- He *is* waiting for the bus.
- She was writing a letter.

An action verb is a word that tells an action.

- Sarah **climbs** the stairs.
- Beth likes watermelon.
- Andrew **thinks** about his party.

The tense of a verb tells when the action happens. This table explains the verb tenses.

Add -s or -es to most verbs	Add <i>-ed</i> to most verbs	Add the helping verb <i>will</i> to most verbs
