# **Descriptive Adjectives**

**Descriptive adjectives** tell *what kind*, *which one*, and *how many*. When you write, make sure that you use descriptive adjectives correctly. Remember that adjectives can be written in different parts of the sentence.

# Example 1

- Martha is wearing a red dress.
- I have a friendly dog.
- Scott bought fresh fruit.

- Martha's dress is red.
- My dog is friendly.
- The fruit Scott bought is fresh.

# **Adjectives That Compare**

Adjectives that compare two or more things often use the suffixes *-er* and *-est*. When you write, it is important that you use these adjectives correctly.

## Comparative Adjectives Use -er

- My pencil is shorter than yours.
- This path is <u>rockier</u> than the first one.

### Superlative Adjectives Use -est

- Clay's pencil is the shortest.
- The path by the lake is the rockiest one in the park.
