# **Adjectives That Compare**

Comparative adjectives compare two things, and superlative adjectives compare three or more things. Use *-er* and *-est* to compare with single-syllable adjectives.

#### Comparative Adjectives -er

- This cup is larger than that cup.
- My tie is shinier than the tie on display.

#### Superlative Adjectives -est

- This is the <u>largest</u> cup in the cupboard.
- This tie is the <u>shiniest</u> tie on the shelves.

### More/Most and Better/Best

When an adjective has more than one syllable, you will usually use *more* to form the comparative and *most* to form the superlative.

Eliza is more comfortable playing the piano than Harry.

Some adjectives have irregular comparative and superlative forms, such as *good/better/best*. These adjectives do not use *-er* and *-est* or *more* and *most*.

Sasha is a good speller, but Eli is the best speller in class.
