

Interjections

Remember that **Interjections** are words or phrases that are used to exclaim, protest, or command. They can stand alone or can be used as part of a sentence.

Interjections are usually found at the beginning of a sentence and are set off from the rest of the sentence by a comma or an exclamation mark.

- *Boy*, that was a huge bowl of ice cream!
- *Ouch!* You stepped on my foot!
