

COVID-19 RESPONSE PROTOCOL

A GUIDE TO DETERMINING NEXT STEPS FOLLOWING COVID-19 SYMPTOMS OR EXPOSURE

What are the symptoms?

Students with ANY high risk COVID-19 symptom or TWO OR MORE low risk COVID-19 symptoms should stay home and contact a healthcare provider.

Students with a temperature of 100.4 F or higher should always stay home until fever free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication.

FREOUENTLY ASKED OUESTIONS:

What's the difference between quarantine and isolation?

QUARANTINE keeps someone who was in close contact with someone who has COVID-19 away from others.

ISOLATION keeps someone who is sick or tested positive for COVID-19 without symptoms away from others, even in their own home.

What is considered a close contact?

CLOSE CONTACT is defined as being within six feet or closer to a positive or symptomatic COVID-19 case during the infected period for 15 minutes or longer.

What happens if someone is re-exposed?

Based on guidance from the Iowa Department of Public Health, individuals who have tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 12 weeks and have since recovered and remain asymptomatic are not required to quarantine or retest.

- » Documentation or official notification of the confirmed COVID-19 positive test within the previous 12 weeks will be required.
- » If new symptoms consistent with COVID-19 develop, the individual will be required to isolate for 10 days and should be clinically evaluated as appropriate.

How does contact tracing work?

Contact tracing falls within the responsibility of the Dubuque Visiting Nurse Association, acting on behalf of the Dubuque County Health Department. as well as the Iowa Department of Public Health. Individuals who have been identified as a close contact through contact tracing will self-quarantine for 10 days.

In the event of a positive case related to the school setting, the VNA will:

- » Contact the school with official notification of confirmed positive case
- » Call all identified close contacts/ potentially exposed individuals
- » Provide education on COVID-19 as well as quarantine and how to monitor symptoms
- » Assist individuals with navigating testing options and opportunities

Schools will support this process by:

- » Identifying, isolating and providing contact information for individuals considered exposed
- » Temporarily preventing the use of areas where the positive case may have been until those areas can be sanitized

What do I do if I have symptoms?

Follow the steps outlined below if you have symptoms, have been tested, or have been exposed.
