International Students

Qualified international students may be enrolled and attend school without tuition charge if they are recommended by a local chapter of an international organization or an approved local organization and have residence for the school year within the boundaries of the district. There will be no more than two (2) students from any sponsoring group or a total of five (5) students enrolled in each high school during any one academic year-, *unless approved by the superintendent or designee*.

Administrative Guidelines

Each high school will have given approval for student acceptance in the school prior to any student assignment by a hosting organization.

Each high school principal will be given one month's advance notice by the hosting organization of the student's educational credentials. Assurance will also be provided to the school that the student has demonstrated English speaking skills.

Each sponsoring organization will be expected to provide a local individual to act as a liaison for the youth.

The following guidelines will apply for all international students:

Student Qualifications:

Students must be secondary school students.

Host Organizations:

Select a host family at least five (5) weeks prior to the student's arrival.

Supervise the youth's activities.

Assume responsibility for resolving

problems. Provide transportation for organizational activities.

Assure the school that adequate clothing, transportation to and from Dubuque, cost above scope of program and accident and medical insurance will be provided for the youth.

The Student Will:

Attend school regularly.

Be able to participate in Drivers Education Program, pending space availability.

Not accept full-time employment.

Follow rules of school.

The Host Family Will:

Provide room and board.

Provide for family trips.

Serve in the role of parents.

Weapons

The Board believes weapons, other dangerous objects, and look-a-likes in school district facilities cause material and substantial disruption to the school environment or present a threat to the health and safety of students, employees, and visitors on the school district premises or properties within the jurisdiction of the school district. School district facilities/vehicles are not an appropriate place for weapons, dangerous objects, and/or look-alikes. Weapons, other dangerous objects, and look-a-likes shall be taken from students and others who bring them on to the school district properties or onto property within the jurisdiction of the school district ("school property") or from students who are within the control of the school district.

Parents of students found to possess weapons, dangerous objects, and/or look-a-likes on school property shall be notified of the incident. Possession or confiscation of weapons, dangerous objects, and/or look-a-likes will be reported to law enforcement officials, and students will be subject to disciplinary action, including but not limited to, suspension or expulsion.

Students bringing firearms to school, or onto school buses/vehicles, or on to school property, or knowingly possessing firearms on school properties will be expelled for not less than one calendar year. The Superintendent has the authority to recommend this expulsion requirement be modified for students on a case-by-case basis. For purposes of this portion of this policy, the term "firearm" includes, but is not limited to, any weapon which is designed to expel a projectile by the action of an explosive; the frame or receiver of any such weapon; a muffler or silencer for such a weapon; or any explosive, incendiary or poison gas; or otherwise defined by applicable law.

Weapons under the control of law enforcement officials or other individuals specifically authorized by the Board are exempt from this policy.

Weapons – Look-Alike

Student is in possession of or uses look-alike weapons, which are items resembling an actual weapon or dangerous object, including, but not limited to, squirt guns, water rifles or pistols, slingshots, toy guns, toy grenades, toy knives or swords, and other similar items.

The Principal shall have the authority to determine the extent and nature of the disciplinary action based upon the student's age, the actions of the student in possessing and using the look-alike weapon, the student's intent, and the nature of the look-alike weapon's resemblance to a real weapon.

Weapons - Firearms - Use and Possession

Possession or use of firearms on school property or at school events is strictly prohibited. Any student found to be in possession of or who uses a firearm on school property or at a school event shall be immediately referred to law enforcement and, pursuant to federal law, expelled from school for not less than one calendar year. The Superintendent has the authority to recommend this expulsion requirement be modified for students on a case-by-case basis.

A firearm is defined as:

(A) Any weapon which will or is designed to or may readily be converted to expel a projectile by the action of an explosive, including but not limited to, a shotgun, a short-barreled shotgun, rifle, short-barreled rifle, ammunition, armor piercing ammunition, machine gun, semi-automatic rifle, handgun, pistol, revolver, starter gun, weapons made from 3D printers;

(B) The frame or receiver of any such weapon;

(C) Any firearm muffler or firearm silencer; or

- (D) Any destructive device.
 - A "destructive device" is

(1) any explosive, incendiary or poison gas, including but not limited to, a bomb, grenade, rocket having propellant charge of more than four ounces, missile having an explosive or incendiary charge of more than one-quarter ounce, mine or similar device; (2) any type of weapon which will, or which may be readily converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive or other propellant, and which has any barrel with a bore of more than one-half inch in diameter; and (3) any combination of parts either designed or intended for use in converting any device into a destructive device and from which a destructive device may be readily assembled.

This section does not apply to:

- Student who possesses firearms under the authority of a school district, such as for demonstration, rifle competition, or firearms safety courses; or
- When it is determined by the Principal, in consultation with the Superintendent that based on the student's age and intent, that expulsion is not appropriate under the circumstances.

Dangerous Weapon (other than firearm) - Use/Possession

Student is in possession of or uses a dangerous weapon or threatens to use a dangerous weapon while having the apparent ability to do so. A "dangerous weapon" is any instrument or device that is not a firearm, designed primarily for use in inflicting death or injury upon another. "Dangerous weapons"

include, but are not limited to: any offensive weapon, dagger, razor, razor blade, or similar instruments with sharp cutting edges; stiletto; switchblade knife; ballistic knife; knife; any portable weapon directing an electric current, impulse, wave or beam that produces a high-voltage pulse designed to immobilize a person; chains; pipes; ice picks; nunchuck sticks; brass knuckles; throwing stars; billy clubs; shanks; and weapons made from 3D printers.

The Principal, in consultation with the Superintendent, shall have the authority to determine the extent and nature of the disciplinary action based upon the student's age, the actions of the student in possessing and using the weapon, and the student's expressed or apparent intent. The following may be taken into consideration in determining disciplinary action:

Level 1: A student is in possession of a weapon but has no intention of using it or displaying it in a threatening manner. (e.g., hunting knife in a student's backpack).

Level 2: A student is in possession of a weapon, is well aware that it's a weapon, and has intent to use it or threatens to use it.

Level 3: A student is in possession of a weapon and either uses it for harm or displays it in a threatening manner.

If Level 1 applies, law enforcement will be consulted. If Level 2 or 3 apply, then in addition to any disciplinary action by the School, the student will be referred to law enforcement.

Chapter 7: AUXILIARY SERVICES Section 1: FOOD AND NUTRITION

Unpaid Meal Accounts

The policy of the Dubuque Community School District is to offer breakfast and lunch to all students within the district. As a student's account approaches a zero balance or becomes negative, the attached administrative guidelines will apply.

Each school will:

- Not deny students meals because of low account balances;
- Not allow students to purchase a la carte when their meal account is at zero balance;
- Allow a student to charge meals up to a negative balance of \$8.85 \$9.45 After the charge limit is reached, an alternate entrée, fruit and milk will be offered for breakfast and lunch until the charges are paid in full. This alternate offering will not be charged to the student's account.
- Students who decline the alternate entrée, fruit and milk, and take the regular meal, will be charged for a full price meal. Parents will be responsible for the charges to the student's account.

Administrative Guidelines

Elementary School

- Once students have reached a zero balance, they may charge any combination of meals (breakfast or lunch) up to a negative balance of \$8.95 \$9.45
- When the negative \$8.85 \$9.45 charge limit is reached, an alternate sandwich, fruit and milk will be offered for lunch, and graham crackers, fruit and milk for breakfast, until the charges are paid in full. This alternate lunch or breakfast will not be charged to the student's account.
- Payment envelopes indicating the student's account balance, for those accounts with less than \$5.00, will be sent home with the students on a weekly basis.
- Parents will receive low balance notification via email through the Meal Magic system.
- Parents will receive a weekly phone call when accounts fall into a negative balance.

Middle School/High School

- Students may charge any combination of meals up to a negative balance of \$8.85. \$9.45
- Snack or a la carte items may only be purchased with a positive account balance.
- When the negative \$8.85 \$9.45 charge limit is reached, an alternate sandwich, fruit and milk will be offered for lunch, and cereal, fruit and milk for breakfast, until charges are paid in full. This alternate lunch or breakfast will not be charged to the student's account.
- If a student with a negative balance attempts to purchase a la carte items with cash, the money must first be applied to the negative balance.
- Students are verbally notified of their account balance at the cash register when the balance falls below \$8.00. \$9.00
- Parents will receive low balance notification via email through the Meal Magic system.
- Parents will receive a weekly phone call when accounts fall into a negative balance.

Employees

- Employees may also establish meal accounts. An employee's meal account balance may not fall below zero.
- Employees will receive low balance notification through the Meal Magic system.

Outstanding Meal Accounts

• The Food and Nutrition Department will make every attempt to notify families of outstanding accounts through email, telephone calls or letters sent via US mail. The department will make every effort to work out a payment plan or help families apply for assistance.
