




Let's Create a Rondo Pattern


To Do: Repeat the Rondo Shape Pattern (A-B-A-C-A)




To Do: Create 2 Rondo Shape Patterns. (Use different shapes than the ones above.)

Have an adult family member read the selected "Calm Down" lyrics below, then answer the questions that follow together to complete your entertainment report.

Instead of those wild, knee-jerk reactions
You gotta catch your own attention
