WHAT'S NEW, PTO?

We are very excited for the school year ahead and are working on a new report card format that will better guide our students and their learning. We are also moving to co-teaching, when possible, to have a smaller teacher/student ratio to better meet the needs of our students. In addition, you may see some interesting chairs in your child's classroom as we are integrating flexible seating choices for our students.

I would like to encourage you all to be a part of our Marshall family by checking out our PTO meetings. All are welcome the first Monday in every month starting at 6:00 p.m. in the library. There are so many great events happening at school and the PTO has been an important contributor to our success.

In addition, this year we will continue our monthly all school "Marshee" assemblies: These assemblies have certificates and recognition given in the following areas:

Attendance – our goal is that everyone is here 100% of the time and a traveling trophy is given to the class with the highest attendance for the month.

Reading – we will be sending home monthly calendars with students for them to record their nightly reading, which is an expectation for all of our students. The calendars should be returned to the school at the end of the month and then these students will be recognized during the assembly.

Character – classroom teachers will be watching for 2 students that demonstrate respect, responsibility and caring and will present certificates at the assembly. Parents are encouraged to attend this presentation. In addition, the class that demonstrates the most character during specialists' classes will be awarded a traveling trophy.

Community Building – lots of fun and surprises, students and staff laughing together and building relationships.

Finally, we will be taking our school assessments in September. FAST reading will be on September 11 and MAP testing will begin last week in September. Please help your child(ren) get to bed on time and start each day with breakfast so they are coming to school ready to learn and doing their best work.

5TH GRADE NEWS

Band & Orchestra – The 5th grade school year started off with a bang...or at least a lot of noise. On Thursday, September 6, orchestra and band teachers from across the district were at Marshall School to give our 5th graders the opportunity to try out many different instruments. They had stations set up with drums, flutes, and violins, to name just a few. Great fun was had by all!

Math – Students have been reviewing averages and will soon be getting into big numbers and fractions. Keep working on those multiplication facts!

LEAD 21 – 5th grade is currently covering a unit that asks the question, "How do we achieve common ground?" BIRTHDAY TREAT REMINDER

The safety of our children is of utmost importance, please remember that edible treats are not an option for birthdays.

We have many students with a wide range of severe, life threatening allergies to various nuts, milk products, wheat, soy, strawberries, kiwi, and much more. Although we are very diligent about monitoring items it is exceedingly difficult to verify the ingredients in any food product.

Non-Edible Birthday treat suggestions:

- *Donate a book to the school library or classroom in honor of your child's birthday.
- *Have your child bring their favorite book to share; the teacher or child may read it to the class.
- *Donate a ball, jump rope or game to the classroom for recess.
- *Provide each student in class with a colorful pencil, sticker, eraser, bookmark or chalk.

Recognition of birthdays or other special events with the delivery of flowers, balloons, stuffed animals, etc. is not encouraged. If items do arrive for students they will be kept in the office until the end of the school day.

LUNCH REMINDERS

Marshall continues to be a part of the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), a FREE lunch and breakfast program. This funding is from both the federal and state level governments and allows our students to qualify regardless of family income. Families are required to complete the form during online registration. If you feel you did not complete the form, please call the office.

Milk is only free when it is part of the complete hot or cold lunch provided by the school district.

If a student brings a packed lunch from home and drinks a milk provided by Marshall, the milk is not free to the student. The cost will be \$.55 per carton. Families may bank money in a student lunch account to use for future milk purchases, or pay daily for the milk.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP OF STUDENTS

Parents and guardians we appreciate you continuing to be careful drivers and walkers with our students back in school. We know Marshall does not have a perfect area for students to be dropped off before heading for the courtyard and their lineup. Please make sure you and your students use the marked crosswalks that are monitored by Marshall staff. Please watch for the cones that mark off safe zones in the street and do not park in the crosswalk areas making it dangerous for students and staff.


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
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
