3RD GRADE NEWS - MRS. OLBERDING, MRS. TAUBER & MRS. VAN CLEVE

Our third grade students are off to a great start this school year! They have been participating in classroom learning and talking about what *excellence* looks like in their work and their behavior. On September 20th, we celebrated John Marshall by sharing facts and singing a song about him at our school assembly. After the assembly, third grade students were able to ring the old school bell in front of Marshall as part of a yearly tradition to celebrate John Marshall's birthday which is September 24.

Social Studies - In social studies students are learning where our community is located compared to other communities in the world. Students are working to be able to identify what hemisphere, continent, country, state and city they live in. They are also studying the locations of the continents and oceans within our world.

Math – Students learned about graphing and how to answer questions by using and exploring the data. Our current focus is on solving various types of story problems using a variety of strategies and recognizing operation clue words. Keep practicing addition and subtraction math facts at home!

Language Arts - Our first unit has been discussing big and small changes around us. Students have been reading various stories and completed different learning tasks such as identifying the main idea and supporting details for what they are reading. In writing and grammar we have been working on types of sentences, sentence writing and making sure to have capital letters and correct punctuation. Please make sure that students are reading 20 minutes, practicing fluency and practicing spelling words each night!

ATTENDANCE REMINDERS - FROM THE MAIN OFFICE

If your student will be absent from school, please call the main off at 563-552-4100 before the tardy bell at 8:40 am (9:40 am on Fridays) or as soon as possible. If you know of a planned absence due to an appointment or family commitment, please call the office with the date(s) prior to the event. The office will call parents, guardians and emergency contacts to check on the safety of missing students whom we do not receive an excuse for their absence. These will be recorded as unexcused when parent/guardians cannot be reached. Attendance is tied to performing well in school, the more your student is here, the more they learn!

BIRTHDAY TREAT REMINDER

The safety of our children is of utmost importance, please remember that edible treats are not an option for birthdays.

We have many students with a wide range of severe, life threatening allergies to various nuts, milk products, wheat, soy, strawberries, kiwi, and much more. Although we are very diligent about monitoring items it is exceedingly difficult to verify the ingredients in any food product.

Non-Edible Birthday treat suggestions:

- *Donate a book to the school library or classroom in honor of your child's birthday.
- *Have your child bring their favorite book to share; the teacher or child may read it to the class.
- *Donate a ball, jump rope or game to the classroom for recess.
- *Provide each student in class with a colorful pencil, sticker, eraser, bookmark or chalk.

 etc. is not encouraged. If items do arrive for students they will be kept in the office until the end of the school day.

Help Your Child Succeed in School: Build the habit of good attendance early School success goes hand in hand with good attendance

DID YOU KNOW:

- -Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind academically
- -Missing 10 percent (or about 6 days every trimester) can make it harder to learn to read
- -Being tardy to school also impacts your child's ability to learn
- -Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up
- -Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school and themselves

Start building this habit in preschool, going to school on time, every day. Good attendance will help your children do well in elementary, middle school, high school, college and as a working adult.

LUNCH REMINDERS

Marshall continues to be a part of the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), a FREE lunch and breakfast program. This funding is from both the federal and state level governments and allows our students to qualify regardless of family income. Families are required to complete the form during online registration. If you feel you did not complete the form, please call the office.

Milk is only free when it is part of the complete hot or cold lunch provided by the school district.

If a student brings a packed lunch from home and drinks a milk provided by Marshall, the milk is not free to the student. The cost will be \$.55 per carton. Families may bank money in a student lunch account to use for future milk purchases, or pay daily for the milk.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP OF STUDENTS

Parents and guardians we appreciate you continuing to be careful drivers and walkers with our students back in school. We know Marshall does not have a perfect area for students to be dropped off before heading for the courtyard and their lineup. Please make sure you and your students use the marked crosswalks that are monitored by Marshall staff. Please watch for the cones that mark off safe zones in the street and do not park in the crosswalk areas making it dangerous for students and staff.

Thank you for your help, student safety is important in and out of the building!
