

TECHNOLOGY NEWS:

In Technology, we have been working on several things. As of now, every classroom has had 2 lessons around being good citizens when they are online. These lessons teach children how to be safe when they are playing games with strangers online, as well as keeping private information to themselves and not sharing it with anyone online. We have also had coding lessons in each grade level. Several classes have worked with Beebots. The students have loved coding these robots to go where they want them to. This year, the 4th and 5th grade classrooms are focusing on computer science skills. We are learning about sequencing, looping, and algorithms. Every month, they will be participating in a computer science class. Our younger students have been working hard on learning how to use Seesaw! They have had fun completing activities and taking a few selfies.

SECOND STEP FOCUS JANUARY



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SECOND STEP- JANUARY

In January, our schoolwide theme is emotion management. In our morning announcements and school assembly we'll be promoting students to notice their own feelings by paying attention to clues in their bodies, and we'll be reminding them to use their *Second Step* skills to calm down:

- Stop- Use your signal
- Name your feeling
- > Clam down: Breath, Count and use Positive self-talk

These skills help students calm down strong emotions when faced with learning and social challenges, which helps then succeed academically and get along well with others.

Second Step lessons specifically teach about calming down strong emotions such as anger, disappointment, frustration, and anxiety. You'll be receiving Home Links that describe why managing strong emotions is important and includes fun activities to do with your child to help him or her identify strong feelings and calm down. We hope the Home Links will give you tools to use together when your child is upset.
