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FIRST GRADE NEWS: Mrs. Hermsen and M'Lis Miller:

Recently First grade began the program connected with the organization project, Rooted. There are only eight first grade classrooms in the district that are part of this program currently. First graders have enjoyed two monthly lessons so far learning about how our local farmers and growers are connected to the food we eat. They listened to a story about how neighbors come together to share a meal and support one another. After the lesson was completed, students were able to make their own mini charcuterie board and enjoy locally grown and produced foods. In February students learned about a dairy farm and were able to make a yogurt parfait. Students are able to take their rooted box home and share with their family after each lesson. Each student receives a newsletter including information about our local providers. The local providers can be found at Dubuque Farmers Market and Project Rooted provides \$5.00 Rooted bucks to spend at the Farmer's Market. We are thankful that our classrooms can enjoy and learn about our locally produced foods.

In Second Step, students have been working on using problem-solving steps. Students are encouraged to use these steps at recess and throughout their day. We encourage students to focus on safe and respectful solutions.

- S: Say the problem without blame
- T: Think of solutions that are safe and respectful
- E: Explore consequences (both good and bad)
- P: Pick the best solution (make your plan)

We look forward to seeing the growth that our students will make in this last Trimester.
