Average daily screen time for children ages 8 to 12 is **five hours** and 33 minutes. 64% of these children reported watching online videos every day. If children are using the internet, they need to be supervised, and need parental controls activated on their devices.

iPhone – Settings – Screen Time – Content & Privacy Restrictions – Content Restrictions – Web Content – Choose access level.

Android – Google Play app – top right tap profile icon – settings family. Parental controls – select type of content you want filtered – choose how to filter or restrict access.
