- Creating relationships to support a safe, empathetic, and inclusive learning environment

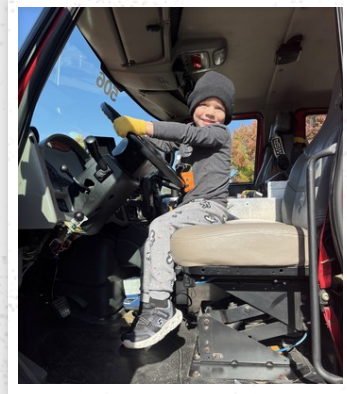

October was another great month of learning at Marshall Elementary! Here are some highlights:

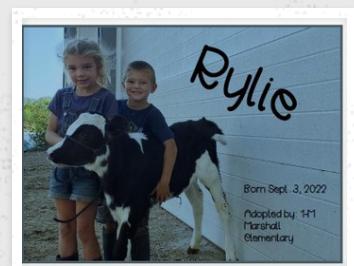
