Greetings! The month of November, our focus for classroom guidance lessons is Conflict Resolution and Communication. Students are learning ways to positively communicate their feelings when in conflict and ways to handle issues on their own first. Each grade has a specific focus on these topics, for example, 5th grade is learning about Bystanders and how they can influence conflict positively or negatively. Students in 2nd grade are learning to Stop, Back Away, and manage their reactions when upset or in conflict. Ask your child what they learned and continue to model positive, open communication even when in conflict!
