# From the desk of Miss Mac:

lowa and other states have developed systems of school accountability and support in response to the federal *Every Student Succeeds Act* (ESSA), the K-12 education law replacing *No Child Left Behind.* 

SAGEVILLE

ESSA maintains a focus on school accountability and equity for all students but shifts decision-making to states and local school districts. We've been working with our district and Keystone AEA.

Under ESSA, states must develop plans for accountability and support, set achievement goals for all students to reach, identify schools for support and improvement every three years, and publish school report cards with data and information.

There are several measures that are weighted. Student growth is weighted at 47% and academic achievement is weighted at 28%. Depending on a school's score, a school could be identified as Comprehensive or Targeted. The state would provide support to improve the school.

I'm pleased to notify you that Sageville Elementary is not identified as Comprehensive or Targeted, however, we continually strive for school improvement.
