How do I pick which instrument I want to play?

- Start by thinking about what instrument sound you liked best. You will be spending a lot of time with your instrument with lessons, rehearsals, and practice at home, you MUST like the sound your instrument makes.
- What instrument did you score a Super or Good on?
 - These are instruments that our staff determined would be a good fit for your future success! You can play an instrument that you scored a with practice, but know that you may have to work harder to be successful.
- If you're still not sure what you want to play this year, see if there is an overlap in the above two categories.

Lessons
