@erms_82 @Mrs_Norby HOUSE 8-3 @erms_house_8.3 **iREADY DIAGNOSTIC ASSESSMENTS** | As you may have seen in a ParentSquare message, this year we are using a different diagnostic assessment to help us in meeting the individual learning needs of all students—the iReady Diagnostic Assessment. This replaces Map Testing at all three grade levels. The iReady is done three times a year in math and language arts class. This online screener and program allows us to determine your child's strengths and areas for growth, it personalizes student learning, and it allows us to monitor progress. It also allows us to meet your child(ren) where they are at and provides us with data to inform future instruction. Our next round of diagnostic screening will be done in January. Look for more information coming home via ParentSquare.

PARENTSQUARE AND CANVAS | We will continue to utilize ParentSquare as the primary online tool for communicating information with families. With ParentSquare, school communications are done in a secure way through email, text, and with the mobile app. We ask that parents and guardians check their email addresses and/or phone numbers on Infinite Campus for accuracy. Depending on your preference settings in ParentSquare, both are potentially utilized to send messages home. Communication with families regarding student homework and class tasks that need to be accomplished will be primarily done through the learning platform, Canvas. Directions for monitoring work in Canvas were sent home via a ParentSquare message last week. You can also keep up with events at school by following our school website, our school Facebook page, or one of many Instagram pages that our staff use to show what is happening at school.

PTO FUNDRAISER | In late September through mid-October, our school will once again be conducting our annual school fundraiser in partnership with our Parent Teacher Organization. We will continue to work with Pinnacle Fundraising, as we have since the opening of our school in 2005. We will be selling magazine subscriptions, various frozen food items, and holiday themed items. Look for more information coming home at the end of this month.

NEW CLASS START TIME | Our opening bell, when students enter the building has remained the same at 7:30 a.m. However, we have a new start time for our first class of the day. Our morning homebase this year starts at 7:36 a.m., instead of 7:38 am as in the past. With the use of back packs and the limited use of lockers, we found last year that we could start our Raptor Time community building activities a couple minutes earlier this year. For our students walking and for families that bring their child(ren) to school, please keep this new start time in mind when coming here in the morning. We recommend all students arrive by the entry bell time. Thanks.

ATHLETICS | It has been great to see so many students participating in our fall after-school athletic programs. I have seen many wonderful learning opportunities happening during seventh and eighth grade volleyball, cross country, and football practices after school. I am excited that our sixth-grade track program starts this week with their first practice. I am thankful for the dedication and work of our coaches. It has also been great to see the sportsmanship displayed by our student athletes in all sports.

MARCHING BAND | Congratulations to the marching band students who performed in the Labor Day Parade downtown this week. They looked and sounded great!

Please do not hesitate to call, email, or stop by my office if you want to talk about anything. We want to continually partner with you in the education of your child(ren) here at Roosevelt. I wish each of you a wonderful September and fall season!



ERMS ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE

If your child(ren) will be out for an extended period of time for a non-illness reason such as a family trip, we ask that you please provide notification to the office a minimum of one week in advance of the first day of absence. There are three options for communicating this with the main office

- 1. You can send a note with your child, OR
- 2. you can call the attendance line at 563-552-5012, OR
- 3. you can send an email to ermsattendance@dbqschools.org

Please include the student name, the dates of the absence and the reason. The student will then receive a letter from the Main Office to be reviewed by each of their teachers so that they are informed of the dates.

Best procedure for your convenience: ERMS Attendance procedure for picking up your student for an appointment during school hours.

- Send a note with your student in the morning.
- The note should include: Student's name, pick-up time, reason for leaving early, and parent's signature.
- The student should bring that note to the main office first thing in the morning. He or she will be given a pass out of class in exchange for the note.
- Then your student will meet you at the east door by the flag pole. And he or she can come out when you pull up to the curb.

Option 2: If you know in advance that your child will miss school you can send an email to ermsattendance@dbqschools.org. Please include your child's name, pick-up time and reason for leaving early.

If you need to pick up your student due to a last minute situation, call the attendance line at 552-5012. If we received the information through a phone call, then you have to meet your student in the building. When picking up your student, you will need to enter the building through the door by the flag pole. Then check in with the secretary at the window. **Please notify us as early in the day as possible so that we can better serve you.**
