NOTES FROM MR. JOHLL

Dear Roosevelt Families.

As we approach the start of the second half of the school year, I hope that this newsletter finds you and your family doing well.

Inclement winter weather is certainly here, and with it, we had our first ever virtual day of instruction this week. Overall, I think it went well. Teachers shared that student participation numbers with their work on Canvas were strong, and that many of them utilized "office hours" through Microsoft Teams to virtually get assistance and support with their work.

I-READY If you are looking for a way to further support your child(ren) in the areas of math and language arts, we invite you to connect with their iReady lessons that they do online. The iReady lessons serve as a great resource for students looking to fill gaps in their learning or to accelerate their understanding of grade level content. Working on them each week will help their teachers figure out what to teach and how to better support them—while also helping them focus their learning on exactly what they need.

We encourage you to make a plan with your student for how they will spend their time at home working on these learning lessons. As you make the plan, please utilize any guidance you've received from your child's teachers on what they should work on. Together you can become familiar with the different parts of the student dashboard, and you can review progress with your child using the 'My Progress' page. At Roosevelt we do recommend that students complete one (1) lesson in math and one (1) lesson in reading each week.

Encourage your child(ren) to take each lesson and quiz question seriously. Emphasize "thinking before clicking" because just clicking through will not be a productive use of their time nor will it accurately reflect what they actually know. Remind them of the importance of carefully reading passages in their

MORNING ARRIVAL | Here are a few reminders for parents and guardians who drive their child(ren) to school. Our opening bell for the school day is 7:30 a.m., Monday through Thursday, and 8:30 a.m. on Friday. Please drop off students as close to that time as possible. The front doors open for breakfast at 7:20 a.m. Our school day starts at 7:36 a.m., Monday through Thursday, and at 8:36 a.m., on Friday. Being at school by that time is critically important as we start our academic classes at that time.

Thank you for helping us be efficient with morning drop-off by having students from FIVE cars de-board all at the same time. We unload two cars on one side of the crossing area, and another three on the back side. This greatly helps with the flow of traffic in the front parking lot. I have noticed that the time to drop off all the students has been reduced by as much as 5 minutes by doing this in the morning. Cars from points west of Roosevelt in Asbury are encouraged to use the Carver School Drop Off Circle by approaching the school from Carver Drive. This helps speed up the drop off time for everyone.

ERMS ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE

If your child(ren) will be out for an extended period of time for a non-illness reason such as a family trip, we ask that you please provide notification to the office a minimum of one week in advance of the first day of absence. There are three options for communicating this with the main office:

- 1. You can send a note with your child, OR
- 2. You can call the attendance line at 563-552-5012, OR
- 3. You can send an email to ermsattendance@dbqschools.org

Please include the student name, the dates of the absence and the reason. The student will then receive a letter from the Main Office to be reviewed by each of their teachers so that they are informed of the dates.

Best procedure for your convenience: ERMS Attendance procedure for picking up your student for an appointment during school hours.

- Send a note with your student in the morning.
- The note should include: student's name, pick-up time, reason for leaving early, and parent's signature.
- The student should bring that note to the main office first thing in the morning. He or she will be given a pass out of class in exchange for the note.
- Then your student will meet you at the east door by the flag pole. And he or she can come out when you pull up to the curb.

Option 2: If you know in advance that your child will miss school you can send an email to ermsattendance@dbqschools.org. Please include your child's name, pick-up time and reason for leaving early.

Then check in with the secretary at the window. **Please notify us as early in the day as possible so that we can better serve you.**

NURSES NOTES

- 1. We can no longer give cough drops or Tums to students.
- 2. Written consent has to be obtained before giving Tylenol or Motrin to students. We can no longer call home for verbal consent.

Reminder, 6th grade students will need a **TDap and Meningitis vaccine** to enter 7th grade next year. Students will be given an unexcused absence if they text/call a parent to go home without visiting the nurse first.

ILLNESS REMINDERS: Students with a temperature of 100.4 F or higher should stay home until fever free for 24 hours without any fever-reducing medication.

If your child is ill, PLEASE keep them home to avoid passing the illness to their class. DCSD requires a student to be free of fever (without Tylenol or Ibuprofen), vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school.

Students with ANY high-risk COVID-19 symptom or TWO OR MORE low-risk COVID-19 symptoms should also stay home.

High risk: New cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, new loss of

taste or smell.

Low risk: Fever or chills, headache, muscle or body aches, fatigue, sore

throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea.

Students who are symptomatic and waiting on COVID-19 test results SHOULD NOT come to school until they receive the results of the test.
