NOTES FROM MR. JOHLL

Dear Roosevelt Families,

I hope this newsletter finds you and your child(ren) refreshed from an enjoyable spring break. Listed below are a few important pieces of information to share with our families.

TORNADO DRILL As we all know, spring brings with it a greater chance of experiencing a severe weather event, including tornadoes. Each year Roosevelt conducts four practice tornado drills, two in the fall and two in the spring. Please know that the safety of all students is of upmost importance to us, and that is why we practice our severe weather expectations. At the end of February, we completed our third drill, and our final one was completed this week. We are fortunate to have a building that allows us to safely shelter all students and staff on our lower level. To be fully prepared, we always have a weather radio that is set to receive warning announcements for Dubuque County and surrounding counties. Upon the announcement of a tornado watch, everyone in the school is notified. The school then continues to operate in a normal manner, but attention to the weather conditions is intensified. Upon receiving a tornado warning, students and staff immediately move to designated tornado shelters. I am always impressed with how our students participate in a serious and responsible way. I am sure we will have the same experience with our final drill. Your help in promoting the seriousness of these drills is very much appreciated.

ID AND LANYARD | Does your child still have her/his school issued student identification (ID) card and lanyard? To provide a safe learning environment for all students at Roosevelt, we do require our students to wear their ID in a visible way at school. This is true for all secondary schools in Dubuque. As we continue with the third trimester of the school year, we are beginning to see an increase in the number of students without an identification card. Please remind your child(ren) that wearing the ID card in a visible way is an important part of our safety plan at Roosevelt. It's also important for checking out library books,

purchasing school lunches, purchasing tickets for dances or PBIS events, etc. If your child(ren) needs a replacement card, please ask them to come to the main office to purchase a new one. The cost for a new ID card is \$3.00. We also sell lanyard for \$2.00, if one is needed.

ISASP | In April we will be administering the annual Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) tests. These are standardized assessments that have been developed by Iowa Testing Programs at the University of Iowa. These REQUIRED tests have been developed specifically for students in our state. They are directly aligned with the Iowa Core standards in reading, math, and science. The information gleaned from these tests provide teachers, students, and parents, with a clear and accurate assessment of learning as it relates to those core standards. Therefore, these tests are very important in helping your child(ren) with their growth in learning here at Roosevelt. Your words of encouragement and your help in promoting the importance of these test is very much needed and appreciated.

Again, this year the Iowa tests will be done completely online. Students will use their school issued laptops to take the tests on our secure server network. Students will take the test in the morning. More information will be coming in a ParentSquare message, but here are the dates for testing:

- Tuesday, April 2 (8th Grade Science)
- Wednesday, April 3 (Reading)
- Wednesday, April 10 (Language and Writing)
- Thursday, April 11 (Math)

ERMS ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE

If your child(ren) will be out for an extended period of time for a non-illness reason such as a family trip, we ask that you please provide notification to the office a minimum of one week in advance of the first day of absence. There are three options for communicating this with the main office:

- 1. You can send a note with your child, OR
- 2. You can call the attendance line at 563-552-5012, OR
- 3. You can send an email to ermsattendance@dbqschools.org

Please include the student name, the dates of the absence and the reason. The student will then receive a letter from the Main Office to be reviewed by each of their teachers so that they are informed of the dates. Best procedure for your convenience: ERMS Attendance procedure for

picking up your student for an appointment during school hours.

- Send a note with your student in the morning.
- The note should include: student's name, pick-up time, reason for leaving early, and parent's signature.
- The student should bring that note to the main office first thing in the morning. He or she will be given a pass out of class in exchange for the note.

If you need to pick up your student due to a last minute situation, call the attendance line at **552-5012**. If we received the information through a phone call, then you have to meet your student in the building. When picking up your student, you will need to enter the building through the door by the flag pole. Then check in with the secretary at the window. **Please notify us as early in the day as possible so that we can better serve you.**

NURSES NOTES

- 1. We can no longer give <u>cough drops or Tums</u> to students.
- 2. Written consent has to be obtained before giving Tylenol or Motrin to students. We can no longer call home for verbal consent.

Reminder, 6th grade students will need a **TDap and Meningitis vaccine** to enter 7th grade next year. Students will be given an unexcused absence if they text/call a parent to go home without visiting the nurse first.

ILLNESS REMINDERS: Students with a temperature of 100.4 F or higher should stay home until fever free for 24 hours without any fever-reducing medication. **If your child is ill, PLEASE keep them home** to avoid passing the illness to their class. DCSD requires a student to be free of fever (without Tylenol or Ibuprofen), vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school.

Students with ANY high-risk COVID-19 symptom or TWO OR MORE lowrisk COVID-19 symptoms should also stay home.

- **High risk:** New cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, new loss of taste or smell.
- **Low risk:** Fever or chills, headache, muscle or body aches, fatigue, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea.

Students who are symptomatic and waiting on COVID-19 test results SHOULD NOT come to school until they receive the results of the test.

GARDEN CLUB DONATES TO ETHIOPIA

The Garden Club at Eleanor Roosevelt Middle School decided to buy and send seeds to Homacho village in Ethiopia. Argaw Oremo, a man from Ethiopia, lectured at Roosevelt Middle School about his life. This inspired the garden club, so they sent many types of seeds to the village in Ethiopia. Mr. Oremo requested pepper, carrot, beet, tomato and watermelon seeds. The garden club felt they might also like a few of their favorite veggies and also sent Swiss chard, okra, eggplant, and beans. The seeds were sent with Don Koppes, who works with the program called Friends of Homacho.

Through our visit with Mr. Koppes, here are some things we learned about life in the community in Ethiopia. Most of the schools in Ethiopia have floors that are covered in cow dung and walls made of sticks and mud. Every Friday, two students at the school must bring in their own cow dung and spread it out over the floor. It is then pounded down and smoothed out. The size of a house is half the size of a science classroom at Roosevelt.



Nobody in this village has running water in their house, and they must use outhouses. Friends of Homacho has built wells to bring water closer to the houses so that girls can attend school and not have to walk miles to get water. Mr. Koppes is taking the seeds to Ethiopia this fall.
