

PARKING LOT SAFETY AND MORNING ARRIVAL | Ensuring the safety of our students during their arrival to school is a high priority. To maintain a safe environment and prevent accidents in the front lot, we kindly ask for your cooperation with the following:

- Drive slowly and follow all directions from staff on duty.
- Watch for students exiting cars and always yield to them in the parking lot.
- Do not cut in front of other vehicles, it increases the risk of an accident.
- Avoid driving off the curb from the parking lot onto the frontage road, as this is dangerous and can lead to accidents.
- Do not drive around a car that is stopped; patience is key to keeping everyone safe.

These precautions are particularly important during the winter months when road conditions can be more hazardous. Thank you for helping us be safe (and efficient) with morning drop-off by having students from five cars deboard simultaneously. We unload two cars on one side of the crossing area and another three on the back side. This greatly helps with the flow of traffic in the front parking lot and provides a safe entry to school. Cars from points west of Roosevelt in Asbury are encouraged to continue using the Carver School Drop-Off Circle. Each day, we aim for a smooth and safe entry into the building for all students and staff.

Please remember that our opening bell for the school day is 7:30 a.m., Monday through Thursday, and 8:30 a.m. on Friday. Please drop off students as close to that time as possible. The front doors open for breakfast at 7:20 a.m. We start our school day at 7:36 a.m., Monday through Thursday, and at 8:36 a.m. on Friday. Being at school by that time is critically important as we start our academic classes promptly at that time.

I-READY For the past couple years we have utilized iReady to further support your child(ren) in the areas of math and language arts. We invite you to connect with their iReady lessons that they do online. The iReady lessons serve as a great resource for students looking to fill gaps in their learning or to accelerate their understanding of grade level content. Working on them each week will help their teachers figure out what to teach and how to better support them—while also helping them focus their learning on exactly what they need.

We encourage you to make a plan with your student for how they will spend their time at home working on these learning lessons. As you make the plan, please utilize any guidance you've received from your child's teachers on what they should work on. Together you can become familiar with the different parts of the student dashboard, and you can review progress with your child using the 'My Progress' page. At Roosevelt we do recommend that students complete one (1) lesson in math and one (1) lesson in reading each week.

Encourage your child(ren) to take each lesson and quiz question seriously. Emphasize "thinking before clicking" because just clicking through will not be a productive use of their time nor will it accurately reflect what they know. Remind them of the importance of carefully reading passages in their entirety along with using paper and pencil to solve math problems.

If you have questions about utilizing iReady, I encourage you to email or call your child's teacher. Thank you for your support of these lessons.

ERMS ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE

If your child(ren) will be out for an extended period of time for a non-illness reason such as a family trip, we ask that you please provide notification to the office a minimum of one week in advance of the first day of absence. There are three options for communicating this with the main office:

- 1. You can send a note with your child, OR
- 2. You can call the attendance line at 563-552-5012, OR
- 3. You can send an email to ermsattendance@dbqschools.org

Please include the student name, the dates of the absence and the reason. The student will then receive a letter from the Main Office to be reviewed by each of their teachers so that they are informed of the dates.

ERMS Attendance procedure for pick up during school hours... Option 1 (Best procedure for your convenience): Send a note with your student in the morning

student in the morning.

- The note should include: student's name, pick-up time, reason for leaving early, and parent's signature.
- The student should bring that note to the main office first thing in the morning. He or she will be given a pass out of class in exchange for the note.
- Then your student will meet you at the east door by the flag pole and can come out when you pull up to the curb.


