Prerequisite: English 1-2

This course uses a thematic approach to literary genres: short story, novel, drama, poetry, and non-fiction. Reading, writing, speaking, technology, and listening skills will be incorporated into each unit. Students will read and analyze literature to clarify their own beliefs and values with a focus on literature from around the world. In addition to literary study, students engage in argumentative, narrative, expository, creative and personal writing, as well as research and literary analysis. Class discussion is an integral part of class.

Vocabulary, grammar and usage, and other composition skills will be emphasized as a continuation of English 1-2.
