ISASP Testing Results (lowa Statewide Assessment for Student Progress)

Families should have received their child's scores in an email on Wednesday, December 18 regarding last Spring's ISASP (Iowa Statewide Assessment for Student Progress) scores. If you have any questions about the report, please don't hesitate to contact Mrs. Richardson and she can go over the results with you. Because this was the first year the test had been given, there are no norms at this time. Also, we can not compare these results to the former ITP testing because they are not comparable tests.

Overall, Bryant students scored very well! Our 3rd and 4th graders scored higher in math. Our 5th scored higher in reading. Science as a whole was lower for us, but when we look at the district and state, it was an area of weakness across the board. 3rd-5th graders will take the ISASP again this year in April. This year we will be taking it electronically, so our results will come back before the end of the year which will be nice to have data to compare!

PRESCHOOL REGISTRATION FOR 2020-2021

Registration for all the DCSD preschools will be held on Monday, January 13th at 7:00 am. There are two requirements for your child to attend the free four-year old program:

- 1. Your child must be 4 on or before September 15th 2020.
- 2. Your child must be a resident of Iowa.

You may register your child for any preschool program within the district: there are no specific boundaries. There is a limited number of slots for preschool at each school. The doors for registration will not open until 7:00 am at all schools so that all families have equal opportunity to register. Openings will be filled on a first-come basis. You may go on the district website to obtain the forms for registration early January or packets will be available on January 13th.

To register your child, please make sure that you bring your child's birth certificate for proof of age. We also can accept passports or signed immunization certificates. <u>Students cannot register until there is proof of age.</u>

SECONDARY OPEN ENROLLMENT

The initial application time frame for the 2020-2021 school year <u>secondary</u> open enrollment will begin on Wednesday, January 15, 2020 and application will be accepted through 4:30 PM on Monday, March 2, 2020. Applications received after the March 2 deadline may be held until after August registration for consideration.

Elementary open enrollment will run from March 16, 2020 through May 1, 2020. More information to come.

During Computer Science Education Week, December 9 – 13, Bryant students had the opportunity to do an Hour of Code. They used blocks of code to take Steve or Alex on an adventure through one of the Minecraft worlds. Students were also introduced to Bee-Bot, an exciting little robot designed specifically to use with young learners. Another opportunity was given to students to be their own human robot and "run" a program to get to a specific colored square in the hallway.

The Hour of Code is an opportunity for every student to try computer science for one hour in a fun, simple way. It is part of a campaign that Code.org, a non-profit organization, launched in the United States with the goal of introducing coding into the curriculum and raising awareness around what coding is. It is now celebrated internationally.

Computer science opens more doors for students than any other discipline in today's world. Learning even the basics will help students in virtually any career—from architecture to zoology. It's important for every 21st century student to have a chance to learn how the
