Dear Eisenhower Families,

What a crazy winter we are having! I know none of us can control the weather but I want to apologize and thank you for your continued patience and understanding with the many weather related school delays, early releases, and cancellations. Our superintendent puts a priority on student safety so please know that these school schedule changes due to weather are not made lightly. One of these days we'll get a normal, uninterrupted week of school. Right?

Despite the interruptions to our schedules, we still were able to get quite a bit done in January. Students participated in the Hour of Code activities where they learned the basics of coding and what a job in the IT field would look like. Our 2nd and 3rd graders continued to practice for their upcoming concert on February 26th at Roosevelt. Our teachers continued to provide instruction to students centered around the core standards. And almost all students took the FAST winter reading assessment and we'll share those results with you at conferences. On our Friday late starts, our teachers have received additional professional development in the area of Seesaw and you should see some outcomes of that at conferences. We also continued to look more deeply at the core learning standards and ensured that our instruction and assessments for the 2nd trimester are tightly aligned with the concepts we want our students to master.

Speaking of conferences, they are right around the corner. This spring we will offer conferences on Tuesday, February 12 (4:10-7:50 p.m.), Wednesday, February 13 (4:10-8:10 p.m.), and Thursday, February 14 (7:50 a.m.-12:50 p.m.). The online conference scheduling website was again used so you could sign up for a time that worked for your family. You can call the office if you have any questions about your scheduled date/time.

In addition to conferences, this is also the month with Valentine's Day, typically a highlight for elementary students to celebrate friendship and kindness with tier classmates. Please remember that Valentine's Day is <u>not</u> an opportunity to have a popularity contest or to see who can bring in the best cards or treats. We do have a district wellness policy to adhere to but in the spirit of the holiday, as in the past, I am granting special permission <u>if</u> your child wishes to include a SMALL treat with their valentines. <u>If</u> you choose to do this, do so in moderation and know that the treats will be sent home with the cards to be enjoyed at home. Remember that we also have a number of students with food allergies so please be mindful of that and adhere to any special directions you receive from your child's classroom teacher. For everyone, <u>please refrain from sending any cupcakes</u>, <u>cookies</u>, or <u>cakes</u>.

As I mentioned before, this month we have our 2nd and 3rd grade music concert taking place on Tuesday, February 26 at Roosevelt Middle School. Students arrive at 6:00 with parents and the concert begins at 6:30 in the auditorium. We will see all 2nd and 3rd grade students and families there!

One last reminder regarding drop off and pick up times. Students should not arrive to school until 8:15 a.m. We do not have supervision on our playground nor cross walk workers until that time. Thank you for slowing down and driving carefully as you pull through our parking lot. Our drop off area does get congested at times and I thank you for your understanding while our crossing guards attempt to keep traffic moving in and out of the lot. During the month of February, the theme of "Protective Behaviors/Keeping Safe," will be discussed in our guidance lessons. Although there are times of disagreement and conflict, students will learn about maintaining positive interactions and working with one another in thoughtful, peaceful ways. *Bullying and harassment* behaviors are defined as being one-sided consisting of repeated and unwanted actions and/or words that intimidate, threaten and harm a targeted individual. We will review and discuss the effects of bullying and harassment on the individual, and then we will work through the steps that can be taken to protect and stop the bullying. *Bullying and harassment* can be in our homes, in our schools, in our work environments, and within the community. Classroom lessons will emphasize the role of bystanders with role-plays of various situations in which students help the person being bullied by intervening and taking the targeted student away to a safer area. Through these efforts, we will be able to assist our students as we continue our efforts to eliminate bullying, and improve the relationships and interactions of our students.

Please feel free to use your time as parents in helping us at Eisenhower create and maintain a positive school climate by providing the necessary support to your son/daughter so that s/he treats others with respect and dignity. Your efforts make all the difference in the lives of our children. Together, we can make Eisenhower as safe and bully-free as possible.

Have your child live by these rules daily, and you will be instilling in them a healthy lifestyle that can follow them throughout their lives. AND as an adult, if you would follow these guidelines, you too may see your feelings of health improve over time. So simple to know and so worth the time to implement!

- 5--5 servings of fruits or vegetables
- 4--4 eight ounce glasses of water
- 3--3 servings of a dairy product (low fat preferred)
- 2--2 hours or less of screen time (this includes tablets, computers, and TV)
- 1--1 hour or more of physical activity
