
Have a great month! We are thankful for our partnership with our AWESOME Eisenhower families and we love your faces!

Hello Eisenhower families! In November, students will learn about our new schoolwide conflict resolution tool, Kelso's Choices. Students will be taught to peacefully resolve small conflicts among themselves. Students are taught nine different strategies – "Kelso's Choices" – to solve problems. If students cannot resolve the problem after trying two of Kelso's Choices, they are taught to seek help from an adult. Students will learn how to differentiate between a "small" problem (annoying or frustrating) and a "BIG" problem (scary or dangerous), and that "BIG" problems should always be reported to an adult.

Hello Eisenhower families! It is hard to believe we are in November already! We have entered that time of year to expect cold and flu symptoms. Please note the following health reminders:

- -Students are allowed to use cough drops during the day. Please send the cough drops to school along with a note giving your child permission.
- -If your child has a fever, vomiting, and/or diarrhea, he/she must be symptom free for 24 hours before they are able to return to school.
- -If your child is diagnosed with strep throat, he/she must be on an antibiotic for 24 hours before returning to school.
- -When calling in to the main office, please remember to give a brief but specific description of your child's illness.
