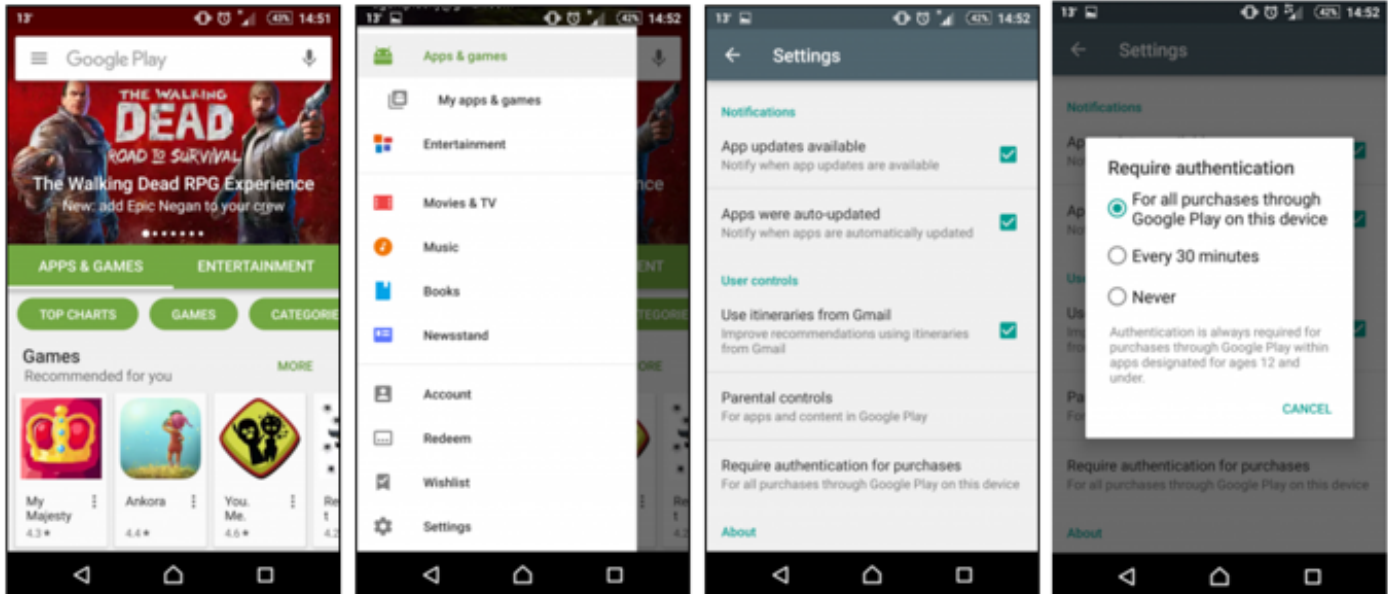




Android Parental Controls



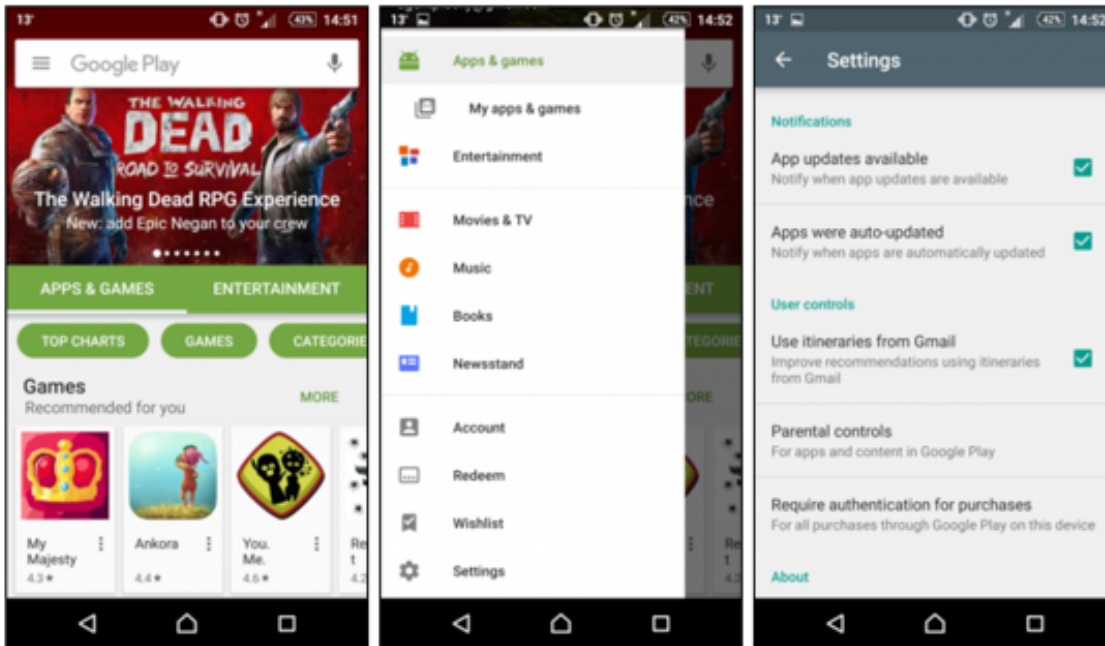
1. From your apps list, open the **Play Store**.
2. Touch the **menu** button, which looks like three lines in the top-left corner of the Play Store (next to the search box).
3. From the menu which appears, scroll down and press **Settings** from the bottom of the list.
4. Find and tap on **Require authentication for purchases**.
5. You can pick whether you are asked for your Google password every time you download from the Play Store, or to only ask you for a password every 30 minutes, which might make it a bit more comfortable to use.

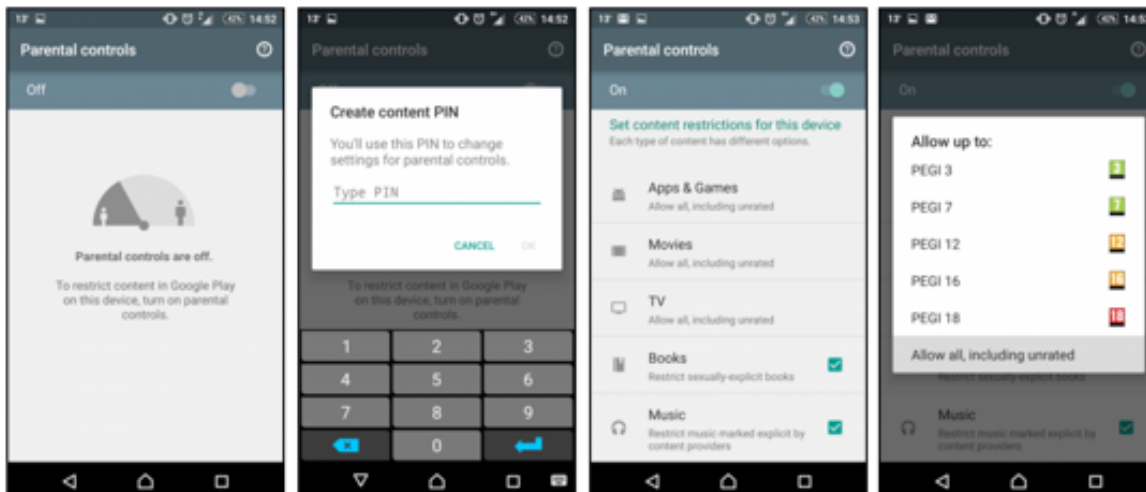

Content Filtering

You can filter the Play Store to only show apps that are appropriate for children, and the process is very easy to follow:



1. Firstly, head back into the Play Store app and press the **menu** button, which looks like.
2. Choose **Settings**.
3. Scroll down to the *User controls* heading and press **Parental controls**.
4. Enter a PIN to protect your changes from being undone. You'll have to confirm it to make sure you know what it is!



5. Make sure the parental controls are turned **on**, then tap on a category to set the appropriate age rating.
6. Each category is set individually, meaning you could allow a higher age rating for TV than for games or movies. Tap on each one you'd like to restrict and choose an age rating. Press the **Home** button when you're finished configuring.
